₩ Welcome in the name of Jesus! ★

Today we observe the First Sunday of Advent. This day marks the beginning of a new Church Year, and it initiates for the Church a season of somber repentance, in which we eagerly look forward to the coming of Jesus. On this First Sunday of Advent, we focus especially on Jesus' role as our King, who comes to save His people and to bestow righteousness upon us, so that we might stand before God's throne in everlasting joy.

If you are a <u>VISITOR</u> here, we offer you our warmest welcome! We pray that your experience among us is blessed, and that you depart filled with God's peace and life.

Also, toward the end of our service today we will be celebrating Holy Communion, in which we will eat and drink Jesus' body and blood, under bread and wine, for the forgiveness of our sins (Matthew 26:26-28). Therefore, we ask that you would please see the statement titled "On the Sacrament of Holy Communion," printed below, which describes our beliefs and practices regarding this sacred gift.

O Lord, my creator, redeemer, and comforter, as I come to worship You in spirit and in truth, I humbly pray that You would open my heart to the preaching of Your Word so that I may repent of my sins, believe in Jesus Christ as my only Savior, and grow in grace and holiness. Hear me for the sake of His name. Amen.

ON THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION: We believe that receiving Holy Communion together is a sacred expression of Christian unity, which includes unity in doctrine (1 Cor. 10:16-17; 1 Cor. 1:10; Eph. 4:5). We also believe that if we receive this sacrament in unbelief, we risk God's judgment (1 Cor. 11:27-30).

Therefore, communion at this altar is reserved for those who believe and confess with us the teachings of our church body, The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. Those who have not been formally instructed in our teachings should wait to commune until completing a course of instruction with us.

If you are a <u>VISITOR</u> and would like to commune with us today, please speak with the pastor before the service. If you will not be communing, you are welcome to kneel at the altar with your arms folded across your chest to receive a blessing, or you may simply remain in your pew.

PLEASE NOTE: Due to COVID-19, the Sharing of the Peace that would normally take place at the beginning of the service has been temporarily suspended.

We hope you will join us for this extra opportunity to receive the Lord's Holy Word during this penitential season!

LET'S DECORATE OUR CHURCH THIS SATURDAY! We are seeking volunteers to help decorate St. Mark's for the Christmas holidays. Toward that end, our Decorate the Church event will be held this **Saturday**, **December 5** starting at 10 a.m. Many hands make for light work, so if you are available to help that morning to help, please wear a face mask and join us!

SEMI-ANNUAL VOTERS' MEETING – All members of St. Mark's ages 18+ are encouraged to attend our upcoming Semi-Annual Voters' Meeting next **Sunday**, **December 6**, in the sanctuary directly following the late service. Items on the Agenda will include voting on the Election Slate, 2021 Budget, an update on the split and sale of the two back lots, and various board and financial reports. As always, for safety's sake, attendees are asked to space themselves out in the pews and wear face masks.

NOW ACCEPTING SUBSCRIPTIONS FOR THE LUTHERAN WITNESS — We are now accepting subscriptions to *The Lutheran Witness* (LW), the official periodical of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. The LW is published 11 times per year and it provides laypeople with stories and information that complement congregational life, fosters personal growth in faith, and helps interpret the contemporary world from a Lutheran Christian perspective. CHRISTMAS WORSHIP SERVICES – This Christmas, due to COVID-19, St. Mark's will be offering <u>two</u> identical Christmas Eve worship services on **Thursday**, **December 24**--one at 4 p.m. and the other at 6 p.m. Our Christmas Day Divine Service on **Friday**, **December 25** will take place at the usual time, 10 a.m. We hope you will make plans now with your family to attend one or more of these special services as we remember, and celebrate, the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus!

TOILETRY/HYGIENE DONATIONS FOR THE OPEN DOOR OUTREACH CENTER — We continue to receive hygiene & toiletry products year around for the Open Door Outreach Center in Waterford. There are two bins located on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs where you can place product donations. The Open Door is a non-profit organization that assists needy families in the Lakes Area. They are ALWAYS in need of toiletry and hygiene items, so **if you can provide any of these throughout the year, it would be appreciated.**

INVISIBLE DAD LUNCH PROGRAM AT KEITH ELEM. – Although area schools will not be resuming in-person classes until sometime down the road, St. Mark's will continue to receive coin donations to help support Keith Elementary's "Invisible Dad" lunch program. This helpful program, started by a dad at Keith, keeps extra money in the school's Invisible Dad Lunch Fund so that if a student's personal lunch account falls too low, or if a student forgets to bring a lunch (or can't afford to bring a lunch), money is available for them to have the same lunch as other students at no cost. This saves the student the embarrassment of being offered only a sandwich wrap and/or cheese/cracker package (the state mandated free items that the school can provide). A clear, glass jar is located on the table at the back of the sanctuary where you can deposit any spare change you might have in order to help support this program. When school starts up again, the contents of the jar will be brought to the principal's office at Keith Elementary. Thanks in advance for your support!

WE CONTINUE TO COLLECT used postage stamps for Wycliffe Bible Translation Ministries, and used eyeglasses for MOST Ministries in the two plastic bins on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs. Wycliffe sells the stamps to stamp collectors and then uses the proceeds to fund Bible translation projects throughout the world. MOST Ministries repairs/refurbishes used eyeglasses and distributes them via eyeglass clinics to the needy around the world. If you donate postage stamps, please be sure to leave ¼" of the envelope paper around the stamp so that the stamp isn't damaged. Thank you.
