## **₩** Welcome in the name of Jesus! ★

Today we celebrate the Third Sunday after Trinity. On this day, we consider the abundant mercy of God in Christ, rejoicing that He seeks us out when we stray and receives us back gladly when we repent. Yeah, at times we all will fall into sin. Indeed, we should each consider ourselves the "foremost" of sinners. And yet God sent Christ to save us, and now He lovingly seeks us out, assuring us that He will receive us back with joy when we repent.

If you are a <u>VISITOR</u> here, we offer you our warmest welcome! We pray that your experience among us is blessed, and that you depart filled with God's peace and life.

Also, toward the end of our service today we will be celebrating Holy Communion, in which we will eat and drink Jesus' body and blood, under bread and wine, for the forgiveness of our sins (Matthew 26:26-28). Therefore, we ask that you would please see the statement titled "On the Sacrament of Holy Communion," printed below, which describes our beliefs and practices regarding this sacred gift.

O Lord, my creator, redeemer, and comforter, as I come to worship You in spirit and in truth, I humbly pray that You would open my heart to the preaching of Your Word so that I may repent of my sins, believe in Jesus Christ as my only Savior, and grow in grace and holiness. Hear me for the sake of His name. Amen.

**ON THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION:** We believe that receiving Holy Communion together is a sacred expression of Christian unity, which includes unity in doctrine (1 Cor. 10:16-17; 1 Cor. 1:10; Eph. 4:5). We also believe that if we receive this sacrament in unbelief, we risk God's judgment (1 Cor. 11:27-30).

Therefore, communion at this altar is reserved for those who believe and confess with us the teachings of our church body, The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. Those who have not been formally instructed in our teachings should wait to commune until completing a course of instruction with us.

If you are a <u>VISITOR</u> and would like to commune with us today, please speak with the pastor before the service. If you will not be communing, you are welcome to kneel at the altar with your arms folded across your chest to receive a blessing, or you may simply remain in your pew.



## **TODAY'S ANNOUNCEMENTS**

NOTE REGARDING OUR CURRENT WORSHIP SERVICES: During this time of COVID-19, some of our church members might feel it's better in their personal situations to wait a bit longer before returning to church. And we totally understand. Because of this, Pastor Vergin will continue to post our full worship services online **through June 28**. Pastor is also available for home visits where private Holy Communion will be given and COVID-19 safety precautions will be used. Please call the church office if you would like to schedule a private visit with Pastor.

PASTOR VERGIN AND SECRETARY DEBBIE will both be out of town on vacation next week. The Vergins will be in Indiana, and the LoCascios will be camping fairly close to home, and they would greatly appreciate prayers for safe travels. This also means that the church office will be closed from **June 29 through July 3**. If you are in need of a pastor during this time, please call Pastor Jonathan Moyer from Faith Lutheran Church in Highland at (810) 771-8177. Pastor Moyer has graciously agreed to fill in for Pastor Vergin while he is on vacation and is available should you have any urgent pastoral needs.

RETURNING TO ONE SERVICE STARTING NEXT SUNDAY, JULY 5 – We will be returning to one worship service at 9:30 a.m. starting next **Sunday, July 5**. Here's what you should expect when our regular Divine Service resumes:

- 1. We will still be distributing hand sanitizer at the entryway, as well as before and after Communion.
- 2. We ask that, at least initially, people wear masks when entering and departing the building and sanctuary (those who wish can remove them once seated at their pew).
- 3. Certain pews will still be closed to maintain spacing between congregants.
- 4. The "Sharing of the Peace," the passing of offering plates, and the common cup will still be temporarily suspended.
- 5. Holy Communion will again be distributed at the altar, but in smaller groups (the Pastor and elder will wear masks during distribution).

Please note that due to technology and time limitations, beginning on July 5, we will have to change how we develop and post our online content. Specifically, since it will now be recorded on Sunday, the service will not be available online until later Sunday or early the next week. Additionally, it will not be formatted/edited as extensively. Thank you for your gracious cooperation and your flexibility during the past few months. We rejoice in the Lord's protection and care, and we look forward to joining together as one in worship once again!

ADULT BIBLE STUDY TO RESUME IN JULY – Our Sunday morning Adult Bible Study will resume starting **July 5**. It will take place in the basement Fellowship Hall starting at 10:45 a.m. We encourage attendees to continue wearing face masks if they can tolerate them, and also to try to sit 6' apart during the study.

SEMI-ANNUAL VOTERS' MEETING – St. Mark's Semi-annual Voters' Meeting will be held on **Sunday, July 12** after the Divine Service in the basement Fellowship Hall. All St. Mark's members age 18+ are invited to attend. MEN'S BIBLE STUDY WILL NOT RESUME UNTIL AUGUST - Because of the pandemic, we have paused our Men's Bible Study over the past few months. Given the current state of things, including the limited service available at restaurants, we will continue this pause in July. However, we hope to resume Men's Bible Study in August. As usual, it will be held on the first Saturday of the month (**August 1**), from 9:00-10:30 a.m. Hopefully, we will be able to hold it at Greek Jalapeno, as usual. We look forward to seeing the men of St. Mark's there! We will keep you updated on specific details as we get closer to August!

REMINDER: Don't forget to periodically check out the BUDGET THERMOMETER located on the bulletin board outside of the church office to see how we're doing financially for 2020! Thanks SO MUCH to all of you for continuing to regularly provide your offerings to St. Mark's either by mailing in your contributions, or participating in our Kindrid online giving program. We truly appreciate it!

INVISIBLE DAD LUNCH PROGRAM AT KEITH ELEM. – Although area schools will not be resuming until September, St. Mark's will continue to receive coin donations to help support Keith Elementary's "Invisible Dad" lunch program. This helpful program, started by a dad at Keith, keeps extra money in the school's Invisible Dad Lunch Fund so that if a student's personal lunch account falls too low, or if a student forgets to bring a lunch (or can't afford to bring a lunch), money is available for them to have the same lunch as other students at no cost. This saves the student the embarrassment of being offered only a sandwich wrap and/or cheese/cracker package (the state mandated free items that the school can provide). A clear, glass jar is located on the table at the back of the sanctuary where you can deposit any spare change you might have in order to help support this program. When school starts up again, the contents of the jar will be brought to the principal's office at Keith Elementary. Thanks in advance for your support!

TOILETRY/HYGIENE DONATIONS FOR THE OPEN DOOR OUTREACH CENTER — We continue to receive hygiene & toiletry products year around for the Open Door Outreach Center in Waterford. There are two bins located on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs where you can place product donations. The Open Door is a non-profit organization that assists needy families in the Lakes Area. They are ALWAYS in need of toiletry and hygiene items, so **if you can provide any of these throughout the year, it would be appreciated.** 

WE CONTINUE TO COLLECT used postage stamps for Wycliffe Bible Translation Ministries, and used eyeglasses for MOST Ministries in the two plastic bins on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs. Wycliffe sells the stamps to stamp collectors and then uses the proceeds to fund Bible translation projects throughout the world. MOST Ministries repairs/refurbishes used eyeglasses and distributes them via eyeglass clinics to the needy around the world. If you donate postage stamps, please be sure to leave ¼" of the envelope paper around the stamp so that the stamp isn't damaged. Thank you.
