Today we observe the Seventh Sunday of Easter. On this day, we remember the hope that we have in Christ in the face of all hostility and persecution. As the Church, Jesus sends us out into a unbelieving world to witness to His salvation, a task which often brings suffering. However, whenever we suffer for Christ we can cling to Him, rejoicing for the opportunity to share in His sufferings, and taking comfort in the eternal victory which He has won.

If you are a <u>VISITOR</u> here, we'd like to offer you our warmest welcome! We pray that your experience among us is blessed, and that you depart filled with God's peace and life.

Also, toward the end of our service today we will be celebrating Holy Communion, in which we will eat and drink Jesus' body and blood, under bread and wine, for the forgiveness of our sins (Matthew 26:26-28). Therefore, we ask that you would please see the statement titled "On the Sacrament of Holy Communion," printed below, which describes our beliefs and practices regarding this sacred gift.

O Lord, my creator, redeemer, and comforter, as I come to worship You in spirit and in truth, I humbly pray that You would open my heart to the preaching of Your Word so that I may repent of my sins, believe in Jesus Christ as my only Savior, and grow in grace and holiness. Hear me for the sake of His name. Amen.

ON THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION: We believe that when we receive Holy Communion together, we are publicly declaring both our unity in Christ and our agreement in doctrine (1 Cor. 10:16-17; 1 Cor. 1:10). We also believe that if we receive this sacrament in unbelief, we risk God's judgment (1 Cor. 11:27-30).

Therefore, communion at this altar is reserved for those who believe and confess the teachings of our church body, The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. Those who have not been formally instructed in our teachings should wait to commune until completing a course of instruction with us.

If you are a <u>VISITOR</u> and would like to commune with us today, please speak with the pastor before the service. If you will not be communing, you are welcome to kneel at the altar with your arms folded across your chest to receive a blessing, or you may simply remain in your pew.


Distribution

TODAY'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

OUR EFFORTS TO HELP MITIGATE CORONAVIRUS – Here's what you can expect for our Sunday morning Divine Services:

- 1. Hand sanitizer will be available on the table in the entryway. The usher will give each communicant a squirt of hand sanitizer before Communion, and sanitizer will be sitting on small tables in the side altar rooms for your use following Communion.
- 2. We ask that people wear masks when moving about the building.
- 3. Certain pews will be closed to maintain spacing between congregants.
- 4. The "Sharing of the Peace," the passing of offering plates, and the common cup will be temporarily suspended.
- 5. Holy Communion will be distributed at the altar, but in smaller groups (the Pastor and elder will wear masks during distribution).

Please note that due to technology and time limitations, our online services will now be recorded **on Sundays**, so the services will not be available online until later Sunday afternoon or early the next week. Thank you for your gracious cooperation and your flexibility!

SUNDAY MORNING ADULT BIBLE STUDY – Please join Pastor Vergin after church **today** in the basement Fellowship Hall for Adult Bible Study starting **at 10:45 a.m.** He will resume teaching on the book of Genesis. Bring your friends and family to this educational study!

TWO ADDITIONAL FESTIVAL WORSHIP SERVICES IN MAY – Next **Sunday, May 23**, we will gather in the sanctuary to celebrate and remember the Day of Pentecost where, ten days after ascending to the Father, Jesus sent the promised Holy Spirit. Then on **Sunday, May 30**, we will gather again to celebrate and remember the Holy Trinity, rejoicing that God has revealed Himself to us in truth as we worship Him as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—one God, and yet three persons.

WHERE WILL WE SEND OUR TITHE? Last year, before we put our unused property up for sale, our congregation committed—as an act of thanksgiving to God and an expression of faith—to tithe 10% of the proceeds to support the mission of the Gospel in another place. Now that the sale is complete, we get to decide where we want to send this gift, totaling \$12,000. What a joyous opportunity! During the month of May, we will be taking a preliminary vote to narrow down the options before our June Voters' Meeting. To participate in this preliminary vote, please fill out a Voting Card and place it in the voting box, both of which are located on the table in the back of the sanctuary. Votes must be submitted no later than **Sunday, May 30**. You must be a Voting Member to participate. The list of potential recipients is also located on the back table. If you have any questions, please see Pastor Vergin!

UPCOMING SEMI-ANNUAL VOTERS' MEETING — This summer's Semi-Annual Church Voters' Meeting will take place on **Sunday, June 13**, directly following the Divine Service. The meeting was moved from June 6 due to scheduling conflicts. Please note this important meeting on your calendars now and plan to attend, if you are able.

PRIVATE VISITS WITH PASTOR - During this time of COVID-19, Pastor is available for private pastoral visits where Holy Communion will be given individually and COVID-19 safety precautions will be used (these can be held either at your home or at the church). Please call the church office if you would like to schedule a private visit with Pastor.

RECEIVING MONETARY DONATIONS FOR PROPERTY UPGRADES - As you think about how you might use your recent stimulus money, please consider—as an act of thanksgiving to God and an expression of faith—donating a certain percentage to St. Mark's to help us complete the property upgrades that were a part of our "New Beginnings" plan from last year. TOILETRY/HYGIENE DONATIONS FOR THE OPEN DOOR OUTREACH CENTER — We continue to receive hygiene & toiletry products year around for the Open Door Outreach Center in Waterford. There are two bins located on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs where you can place product donations. The Open Door is a non-profit organization that assists needy families in the Lakes Area. They are ALWAYS in need of toiletry and hygiene items, so **if you can provide any of these throughout the year, it would be appreciated.**

DONATIONS FOR THE *INVISIBLE DAD* LUNCH PROGRAM - The Invisible Dad lunch program was started a few years ago by a dad whose children attend Keith Elementary. The program keeps extra money in the school's Invisible Dad Lunch Fund so that if a student's personal lunch account falls too low, or if a student forgets to bring a lunch (or can't afford to bring a lunch), money is available for them to have the same lunch as other students at no cost. This saves the student the embarrassment of being offered just a sandwich wrap and/or cheese/cracker package (the state mandated free items that the school can provide). St. Mark's will continue to receive any loose change you might like to donate toward this program for next year. A clear, glass jar continues to be located on the table at the back of the sanctuary where you can drop any extra change or bills you might have.

WE CONTINUE TO COLLECT used postage stamps for Wycliffe Bible Translation Ministries, and used eyeglasses for MOST Ministries in the two plastic bins on the shelves at the bottom of the sanctuary stairs. Wycliffe sells the stamps to stamp collectors and then uses the proceeds to fund Bible translation projects throughout the world. MOST Ministries repairs/refurbishes used eyeglasses and distributes them via eyeglass clinics to the needy around the world. If you donate postage stamps, please be sure to leave 1/4" of the envelope paper around the stamp.
